### ***South Broward Legislative Delegation Speaks Up at Hollywood Chamber's Annual Legislative Update Luncheon***

**HOLLYWOOD, FL** – On June 9, 2010, the Greater Hollywood Chamber of Commerce hosted its Annual Legislative Update Luncheon sponsored by Greenspoon Marder, PA and Florida Power & Light.

Held at the Hollywood Beach Marriott, the South Broward Legislative Delegation was invited to address the community on the recent legislative session and on the Amendment 4 to be on the November 2, 2010 Florida ballot.

Panelists included Florida State Senators Dan Gelber and Eleanor Sobel along with Florida State Representatives Elaine Schwartz, Joseph Gibbons and Evan Jenne. Guest moderator was Justin Sayfie of Blosser & Sayfie.

The South Florida Delegation all agreed that Amendment 4 MUST be stopped for it would be devastating to our state especially to South Florida. The Greater Hollywood Chamber of Commerce's Board of Directors unanimously voted in April to position itself against Amendment 4 and committed to taking an active role in educating our community about its detrimental impact.

According to [www.florida2010.org](http://www.florida2010.org) the proposed amendment would "require taxpayer-funded referenda on all changes to local government comprehensive plans. In other words, this 'Vote on Everything' amendment would force Floridians – not the representatives they elect – to decide hundreds of technical comprehensive plan changes each year."

State Representative Evan Jenne added that "there would be no purpose" for our local city halls, state representatives, county commissioners, etc. if this amendment were to pass.
